On August 3 (Thursday from 4 – 5:50 PM) at Div. 15’s opening reception, we will honor Div. 15 Committee chairs and members, past-presidents, early career educational psychologists, doctoral students participating in the Claire Ellen Weinstein Annual Graduate Seminar, our first international student research awardee, and nominees for two graduate student poster awards. Like last year, you will have an opportunity to view posters and chat with graduate students nominated this year. The Saturday schedule (Aug. 5) includes presentations from our 2016 research award winners (Thorndike, Snow, and Pintrich awardees) from 10 – 11:50 AM and Past-President Nancy Perry (4 PM).
