As I was approaching tenure, I submitted a three-study manuscript for publication in a well-respected psychological journal. It was, I thought, crucial for a positive tenure decision, in part because it was my first publication including causal attributions. I thus was very nervous about the decision. My anxiety was exacerbated by the reputation of the journal editor, who was known to be smart, exceedingly critical, and very wordy (although perhaps that describes most journal editors). He lived up to his reputation. My manuscript was returned with a “revise and resubmit,” accompanied by a commentary about its shortcomings that actually was longer than the submission. I could not read the review for a few days because I was so desperate but then poured over his feedback, addressing as many of his serious doubts as possible. The extended time needed to understand his comments provided the chance to complete another study, which I added to the resubmission. This process was reiterated on two more occasions until a final positive decision was reached regarding the manuscript, which now included six studies. I am pleased to report that it remains one of my most highly cited papers. Here are some publication guidelines I took away from this experience:

- ☐ Editors are appointed to that position for a reason – they tend to be smart, critical, and wordy. Take their feedback seriously and use it to improve your work, rather than searching for strategies that might “mask” some deficiency.
- ☐ More is usually better. I was given the opportunity to include many studies because of the review process but should have pursued this goal without the external push. The later studies should replicate some findings reported in the prior research. This will increase attention to the paper and add confidence in the publication as well as demonstrating a systematic approach to some problem – all positive inputs for academic advancement.
- ☐ Publication of multiple studies often requires a relatively simple methodology and a focused idea, so that the research can be completed in a very timely manner. If you want to examine the effects of early socialization on subsequent marital success, promotions may be hard to attain. But if this is the issue of significance to you, then have some related and meaningful research that can be easily conducted in the intervening period.
- ☐ One clear correlate of publication success is persistence. Do not be overly disheartened by a rejection or revise decision; try again, but only after the manuscript is improved. However, persistence in the face of failure is not always a virtue. As the song says: “There is a time to hold um and a time to fold um.” My rule has been, if rejected three times, fold um; that is, three strikes and you are out! Move on, saving what is possible and discarding what is causing the most difficulty. We may be the only industry that throws away 80% of its products, but that is the nature of the academic publishing world. Of course, reviewers, like baseball umpires, are sometimes incorrect. I have what I regard as some very good papers my file drawer because of “unfair” rejections. But then again, I have some questionable papers that have been published in fine journals. God evens the score if there are enough submissions.

*CODAPAR stands for Committee on Division/APA Relations, and promotes the involvement of divisions within APA, fosters psychology as a science and profession, and advocates for divisions. Members are appointed by the APA Board of Directors after Divisions nominate members for open seats; members typically represent more than one Division.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

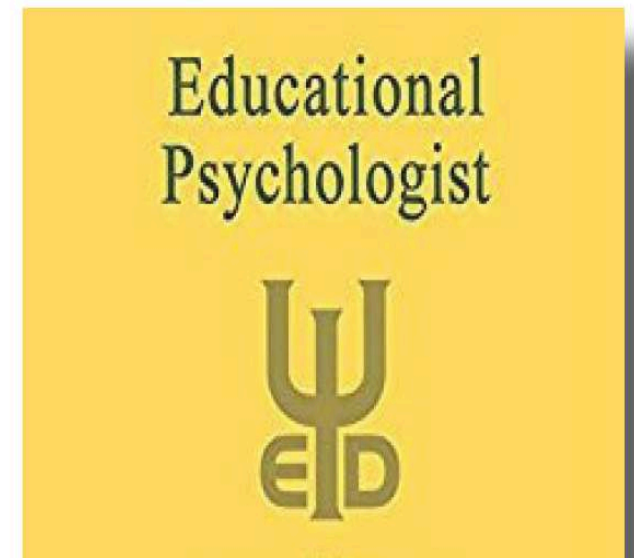

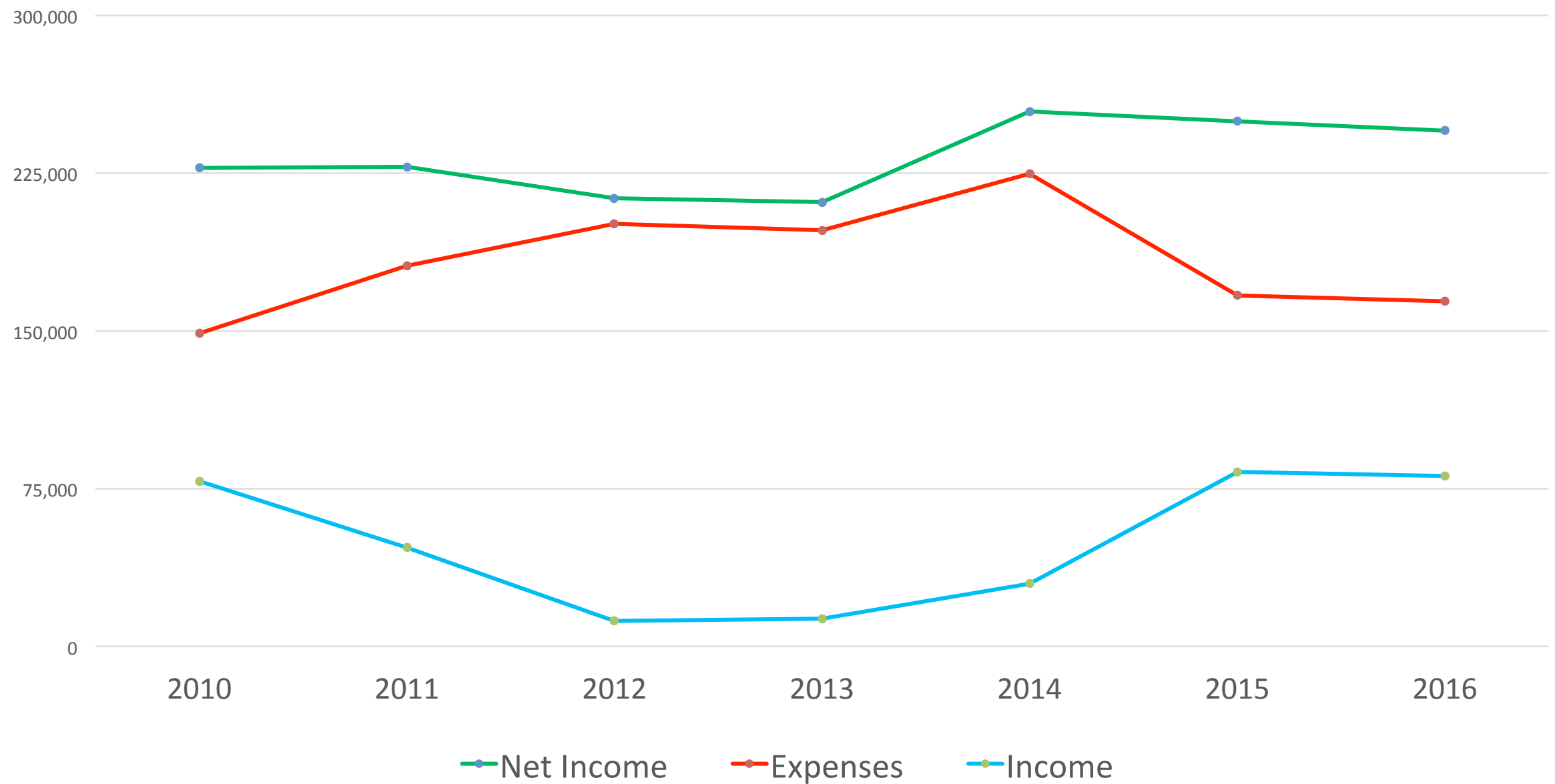

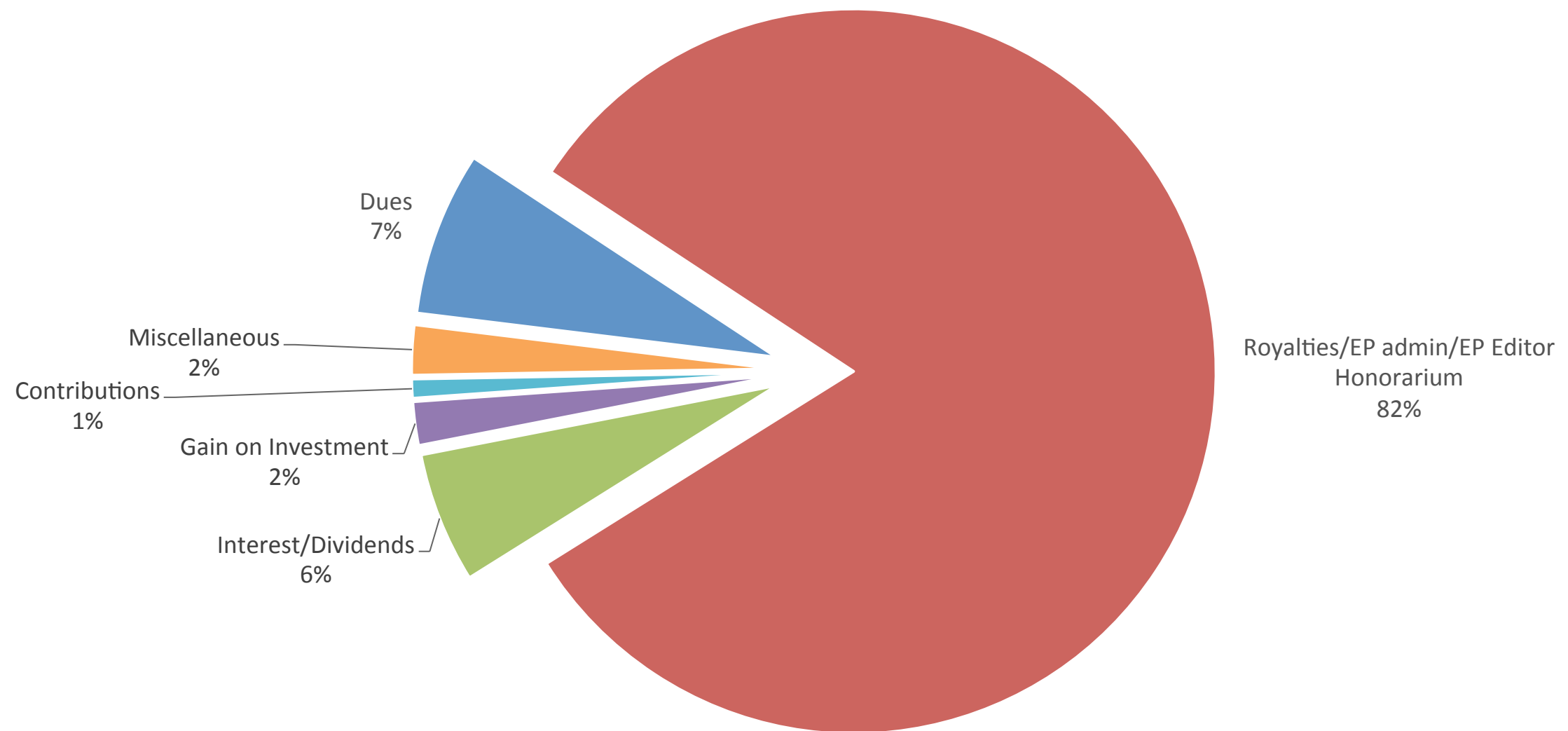

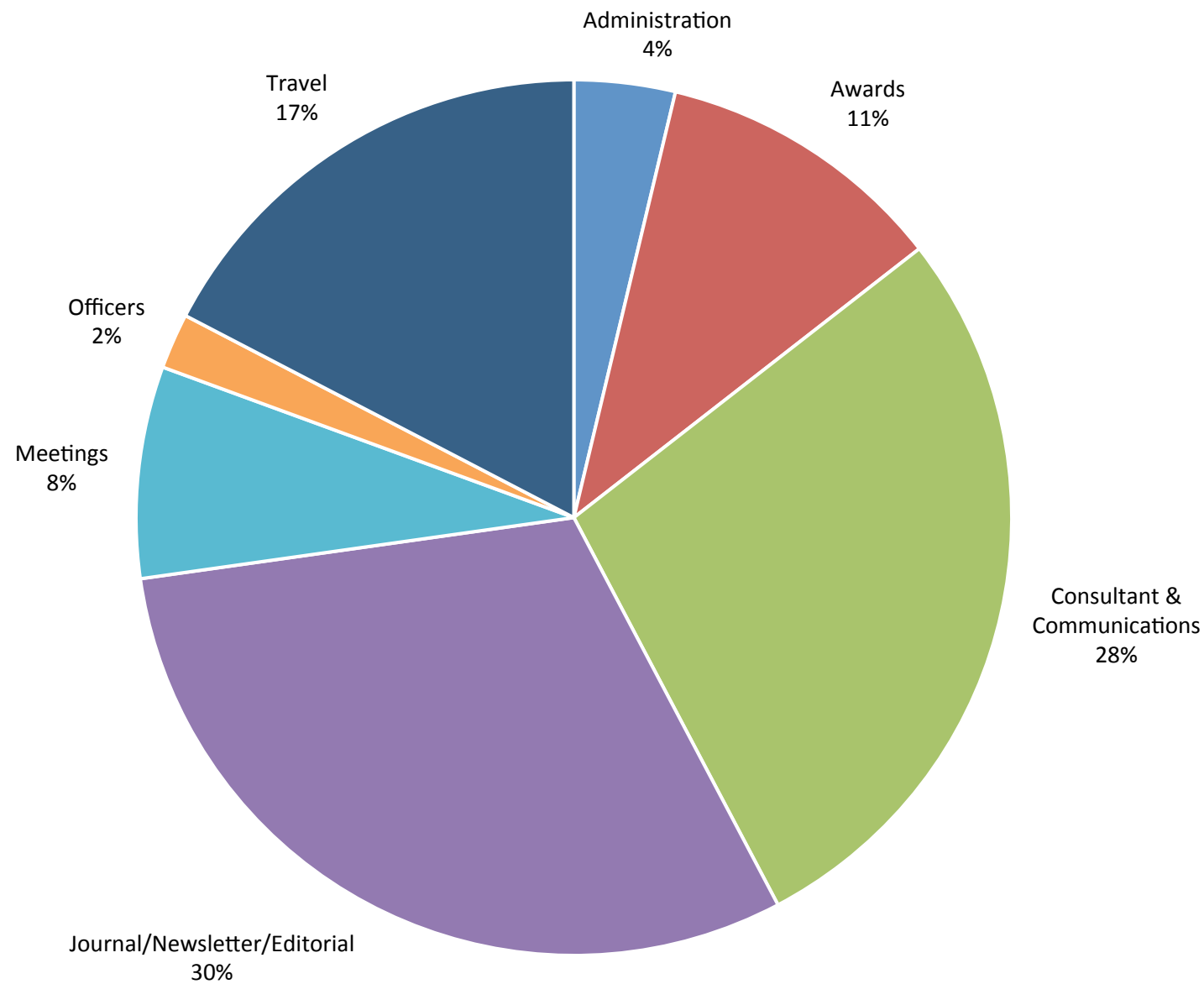
Income & Expenses Trends

Treasurer Comments & Recommendations

- Our net income in 2016 was \$81,171.39
 - Royalties and allowances for Educational Psychologist continue to be the greatest source of income
 - We should continue to anticipate lower amounts in a renegotiated contract with the publisher
- Assets to date
 - \$268,190 in our checking account
 - \$250,689 in our money market account with Merrill Lynch
 - \$488,058 in our TIAA account as of 12/31/2016.
 - \$515,953.35 in our TIAA account as of 4/30/2017.
 - That means our net assets and total liabilities amount to \$1,124,425.46 as of the end of 2016. The investments in a more aggressive growth plan to obtain financial stability for the Division appear to be effective with an estimated annual income of \$11,036.49

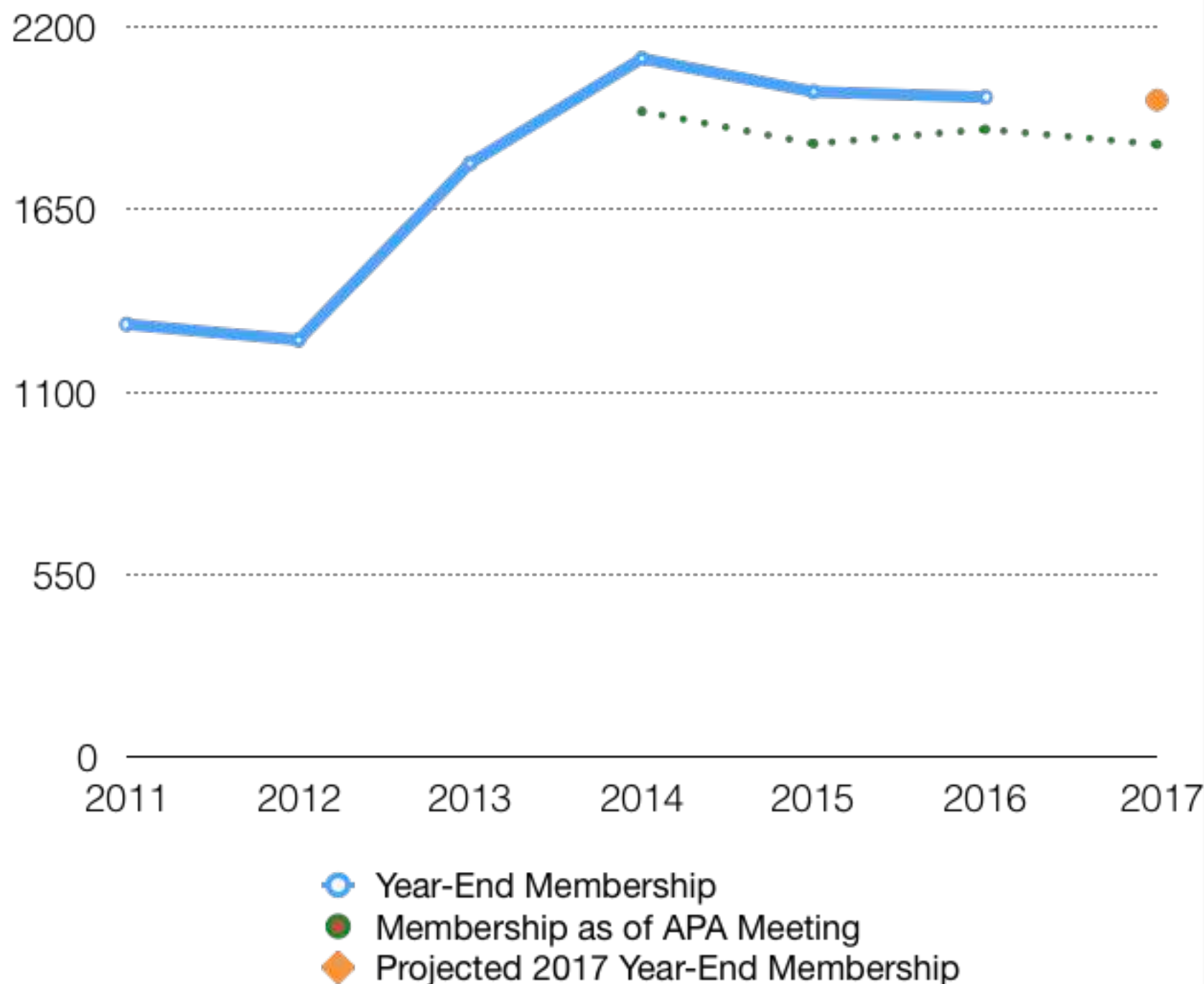

Marty Carr, a professor in the department of educational psychology at the University of Georgia, who dedicated her career to researching the development of mathematics literacy in young children, died from cancer this week on July 30, 2017. A memorial service is expected in a few weeks. Marty's husband predeceased her in 2015. Their daughter, Miranda, is a sophomore at the University of Georgia.

Marty Carr's prominence in both the educational psychology and mathematics education research communities: President and Fellow of Division 15 as well as president of the Women in Mathematics Education organization. Even early this year Marty volunteered to edit Div. 15's future edition of the Handbook of Educational Psychology. Dr. Marty Carr's passion for closing the mathematics achievement gap for students not only provided the field with critical information about how instruction can be improved, but it also helped lay the foundation for future researchers in the field.

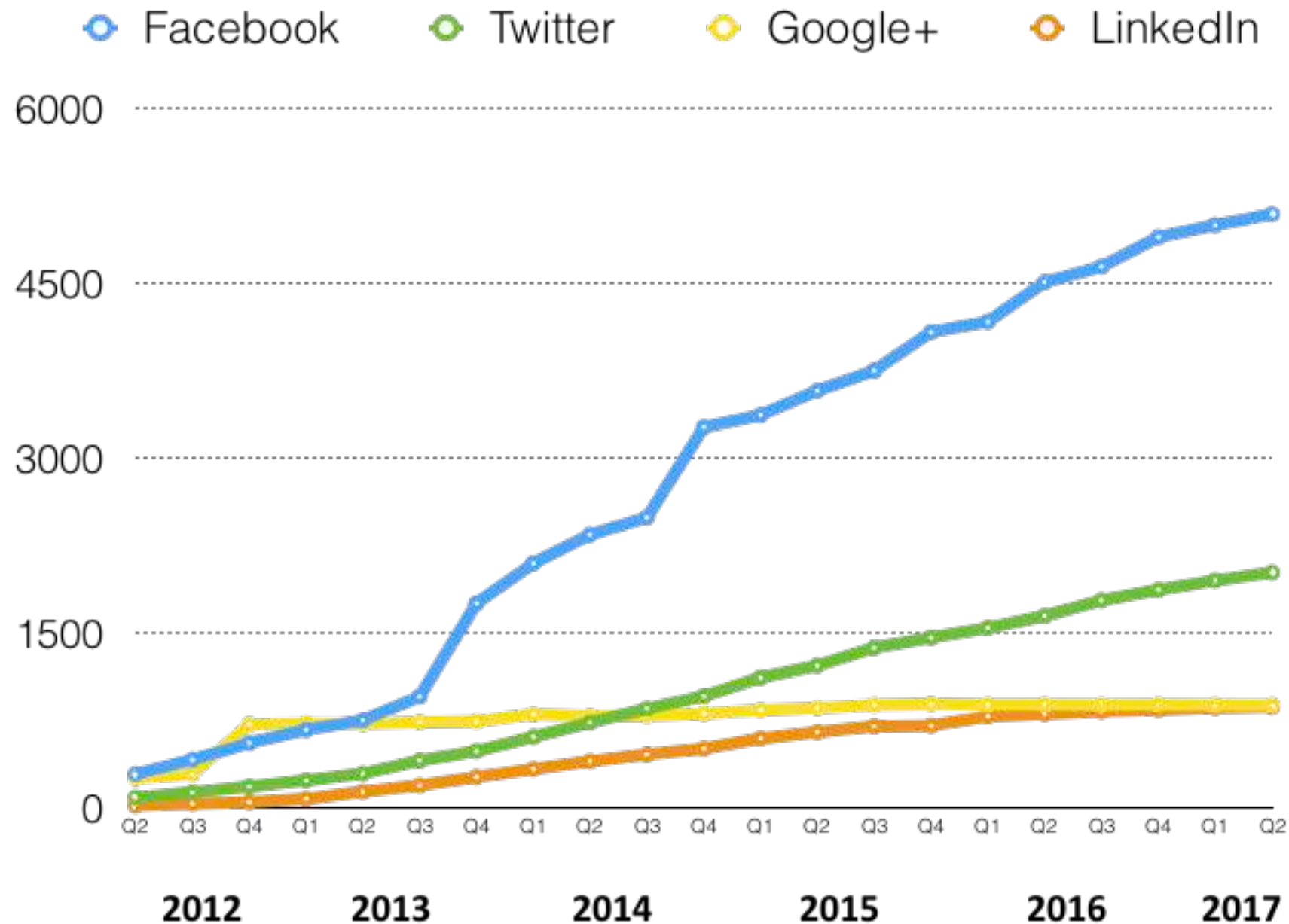


Membership



- As of **July's official roster**, we currently have **1846** enrolled members.
- Historically, we've seen a jump of ~130 members after the APA Convention and prior to year's end (as averaged between the three years this has been tracked). As such, we're projecting **year-end membership of roughly 1975**, which is nearly identical to last year's total and within 6% of the peak we achieved in 2014 prior to the release of the Hoffman Report (after which we experienced a decline in membership sentiment alongside APA and other divisions).
- Beginning after the APA Convention, a new initiative piloted by Wade George and the Membership Committee—"Graduate Student Ambassadors"—will commence with an inaugural class of ~50 members. This program is designed to build relationships with doctoral students and introduce them to Division 15 service. Simultaneously, it allows us to expand the frequency and reach of our messaging to their schools, as the primary objective of this program is to disseminate our messages (including calls to join) among their programs. Finally, this program will allow us to survey students about the issues and challenges they're facing each year, which will inform our services and membership marketing.

Social Growth



Over 8,800 combined social followers—already up 12.8% from 2016's year-end numbers. This puts us among the most followed of all APA Divisions. We expect to hit 10,000+ by the end of the year. Consistent quarterly growth through Facebook, Twitter, and LinkedIn.

Followers connecting predominantly through Facebook (the world's largest and most active social network).

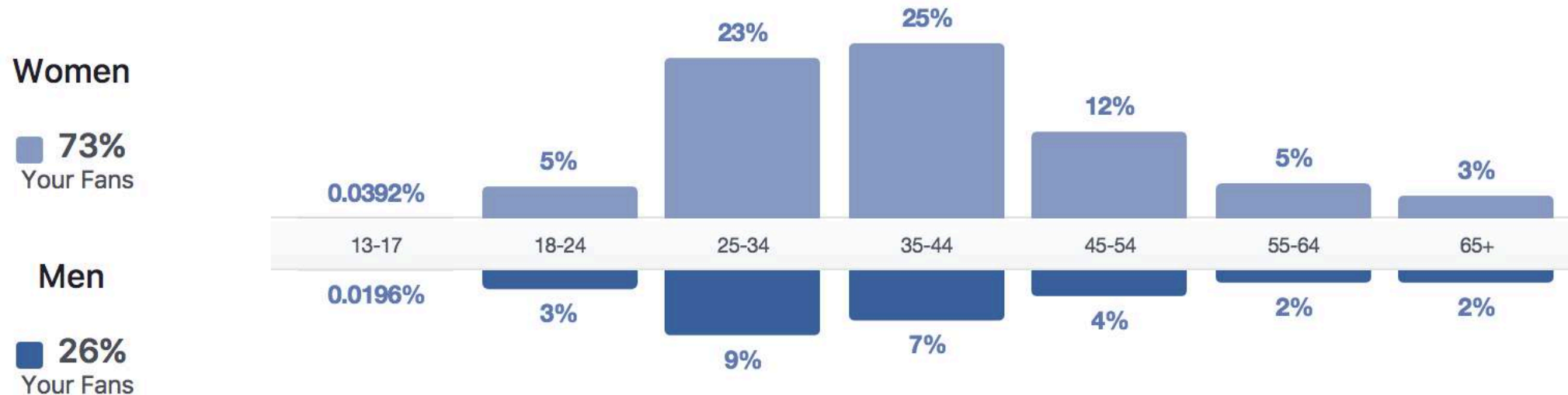
We continue to use both organic and paid advertising to maximize our reach among a well-defined and targeted audience of educational psychologists.

Highlights

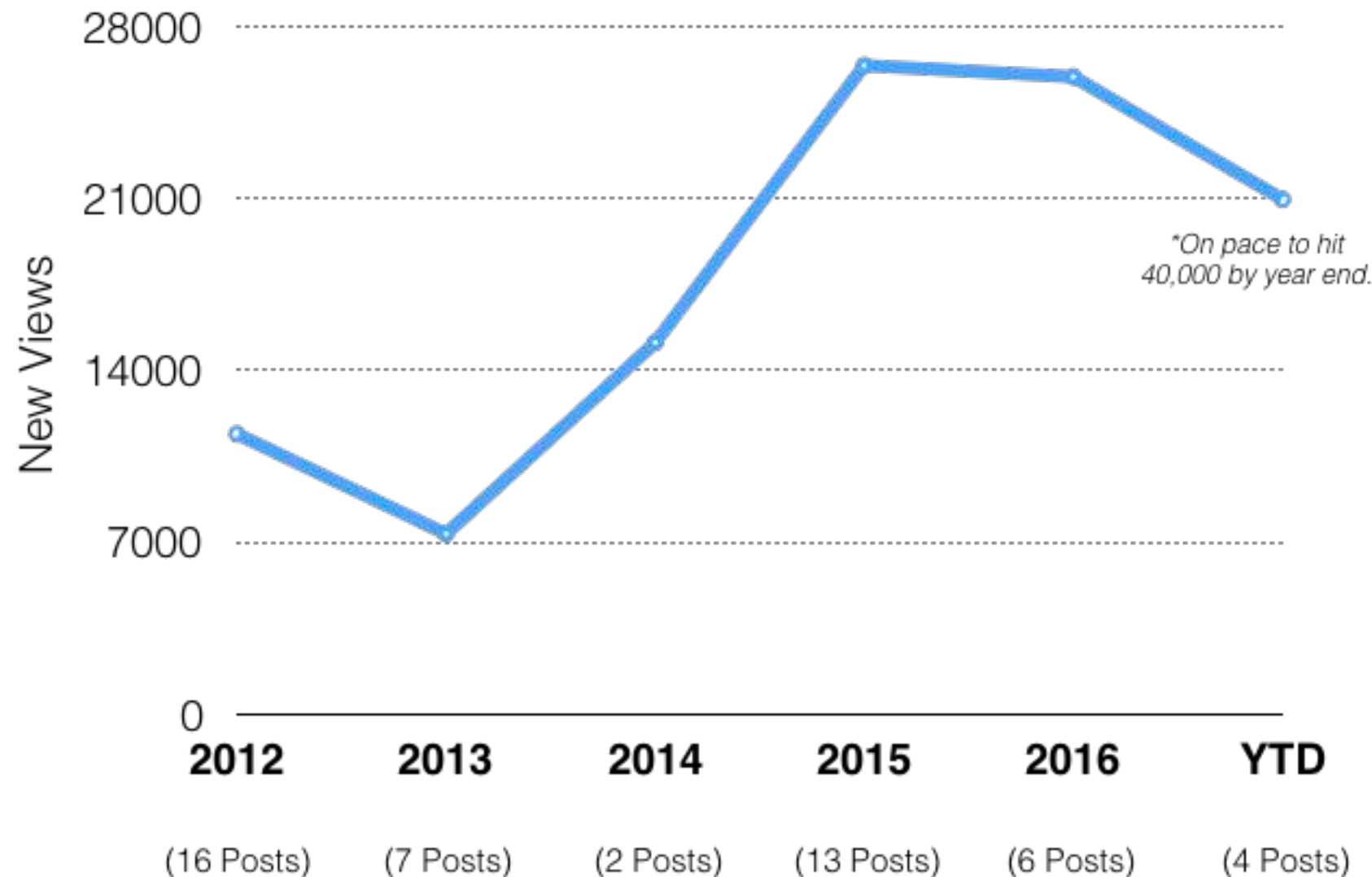
Followers are nearly 3x as likely to identify as female. And, roughly 1/2 of all followers identify as women between the ages of 25-44.

We're currently most effective in reaching those between 25-44 years of age (who constitute 64% of our total following on Facebook). These numbers align well with enrollment of core membership types as of the last Division 15 roster we received.

Just 69% of our users have a listed primary address in the United States (88% have a form of English as their listed primary language). As such, we're doing a good job of proliferating our messaging around the globe.
